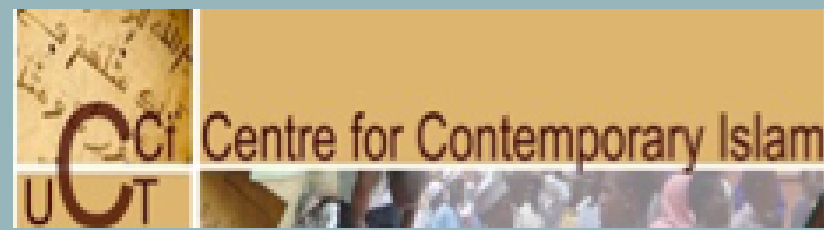

A counsellor and clinical supervisor, co-founded the pioneering course 'Counselling in the Context of Racism' as well as a contemporary model of Islamic Counselling with her partner Stephen Abdullah Maynard. Sabnum is currently co-authoring "Islamic Counselling; a virtue driven approach", to be published by Cambridge University Press.

A counsellor with nearly four decades of experience, is founder of the Lateef Project, a UK based Islamic counselling service. Together with his partner Sabnum Dharamsi, they co-developed a certificate programme, Counselling in the Context of Racism (c.1990) as well as a contemporary therapeutic model 'Islamic Counselling' (c.1996).
